After lunch in Akchour, the journey will continue on an hour drive to the Bleu City of Chefchaouen, the Moroccan Gem, which is arguably one of the prettiest cities of Morocco. Set opposed a wide valley and nestled between two peaks in the gorgeous Rif Mountains, Chefchaouen may surprise you. Its medina has been lovingly maintained with a beautiful shade of blue and whitewashed houses, red-tiled roofs, artistic and creative doorways. Most of the Blue City was renewed by Andalusian refugees, so you might feel you are in small Spanish cities while exploring its streets.

Take a pleasant and relaxed walk through the ancient medina and shop for handicrafts.

you will continue your visit to Chefchaouen's Kasbah that is a heavily restored walled fortress that now contains a lovely garden, a small ethnographic museum, and an even smaller art gallery. The ethnographic museum contains some fascinating views of old Chefchaouen, including the plaza and the kasbah.

The waterfall of Ras El Ma is just beyond the far northeastern gate of Chefchaouen medina. It's here, where the water comes gushing out of the mountain, that local women come to do their washing. The sound of the water and the verdant hills just beyond the medina wall provide a sudden, strong dose of nature.

### Day 4: Fes


After the breakfast at your hotel, with your tour guide, walk through the maze-like old city, known as Fes el Bali. Go back in time into the Middle Ages of the Medina, which is busy with marketers, craftsmen, mosques and tanneries. The old medina's narrow alleys are filled with shops, motorbikes and donkeys piled high with goods is one of the largest car-free urban zones in the world. Pause for lunch at a chic restaurant that is vertiginous and vertical, with cliffs of natural gray stone. Smoked mirror walls and ceilings reflect, endlessly, all perspectives and give the space clear and bright .

Look out for the old Madrassa Bouanania which is the finest of Fez's theological colleges. It was built by the Merenid sultan Bou Inan between 1351 and 1357, and has been impressively restored . As well as the Madrassa El Attarine, founded by Abu Said in 1325 in the heart of the medina, the Attarine was designed as an annex to the nearby Kairouine. The central courtyard displays the traditional patterns of Merenid artisanship .

Without forgetting the Quaraouiyine, one of Africa's largest mosques and possibly the oldest university in the world, this complex is the spiritual heart of Fez and Morocco itself .

You will also witness how the leather is being colored traditionally in the famous tannery. The Chaouwara tanneries are one of the city's most iconic sights (and smells), offering a unique window into the pungent, natural process of producing world-class leather using methods that have changed little since medieval times.

Back to the hotel for dinner and night.
